### \* Seeking Participants for 'Rural Life in a Pandemic- A Diary Project'

Hi, I'm Emilie Whitaker, a Midgley resident and academic at the University of Salford.

I am currently seeking participants for a diary project documenting the everyday rural experience of the pandemic. Participating in the project will contribute to a living social history of the pandemic in this place. Findings from the study will also help to inform future conversations about the needs of rural communities following the immediate impact of the virus.

Through emailed submissions, I want to hear from Midgley residents aged 18+.  
The diary submissions can capture everyday experiences, as close to real time as possible – just like a traditional journal or diary.

**Emailed submissions could include:**

- Word processed diaries
- Simple emails
- Audio Diaries and digital recordings
- Artwork or other creative expressions

The project will run initially for 6 weeks. Participants can send submissions to me as often or as infrequently as they like. Submissions could take place on a daily, weekly, monthly basis, or simply ad-hoc as circumstances allow. I'm very keen to hear from as wide a range of people as possible.
