## Brand New Pyjama Drama Class coming to Midgley

Tuesdays 10 am to 10.45 am.

Starts January 5th 2016 Midgley Community Room.



Pyjama Drama is drama and imaginative play classes for children 2-5 years.

The sessions are packed full of drama games and activities, original songs and music, movement and role play; all which develop key skills in children, such as confidence, communication, co-operation and creative thinking.

The sessions last 35–40 minutes.

It is £5.50 per session or £5 per session if booked for a half term in advance.

If you book for a half term you receive a 'bring a friend' voucher which means you and your friend receive £10 discount next time you book. If you book for a full term you receive the voucher plus a Pyjama Drama tee shirt.

We offer a 3 week minimum booking as you can never tell after 1 week whether a child is going to get into it. Parents/carers stay with the children and are encouraged to be involved in the session.

## PENNINE HORIZONS E-TRAILS



Pennine Horizons have commissioned a series of e-trail apps with map, walk directions, audio commentaries and historical photographs that can be downloaded to a mobile phone or tablet. These e-trails cover the South Pennines and can be downloaded for free.

There are 13 apps available covering our area, the latest one in the Walking with History covers the Ancient Township of Midgley with Luddenden.

A printed route guide is available priced £1.50 from Midgley Shop

This supports the app or allows you to still enjoy the e-trail if you don't have a mobile phone or tablet.

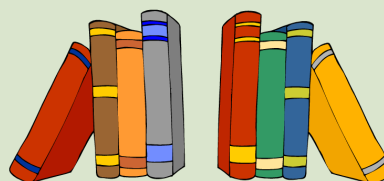


### BOOK CLUB
