**Ian Dewhirst BA., MBE,
Dr of Letters (Bradford)**

17.10.1936-January 2019.

It is with regret that we report the death of Ian.

He was our very first speaker at the Forum when we were seeking to raise funds to find premises and to set up the shop. Since then he has returned 17 times and always given of his services without charge. He was a good friend to the Forum. He had his own inimitable style, proving to be a mine of information and a fount of amusement on matters relating to local history. Talks were never less than 90 minutes, progressed without a break, and held the audience in thrall; they were non-PC in order to illustrate a point. But for his unfortunate death, he would have been treating us again this autumn.

Working 24 years as a Reference Librarian, he lamented the loss of books and documentation and ended his talks by exhorting his audience to **never throw anything away!**

As well as being an Honorary Doctor of Letters from Bradford University and an MBE he also had a train named after him. He has been described as a 'legend' and 'Keighley's greatest living historian'. A prolific local history author, he was also a twice published 'Mills and Boon' writer!

MIDGLEY RECREATION GROUND-UPDATE

Since the last newsletter the renovations to the rec have begun. In December the planters and picnic tables were installed and the planters planted with winter pansies by the school council from Midgley School.

Work will begin during week commencing 18th February to install the younger children's play area with four pieces of equipment that the children chose.



The work should take about a week to complete (weather dependent).

We have applied to Tesco Bags of Help Scheme for one of the older children's pieces of equipment.



For the remainder of the project, in addition to further contributions from Midgley Community Forum and MMAL as we continue to generate funds, we will look into the possibilities of obtaining smaller grants, sponsorship/donations from the local business community and the children from Midgley School Council are to come up with some fund raising ideas. We already have collection boxes in the shop, the school and the Lord Nelson in Luddenden, for anyone who would like to donate. The aim is to have the whole project completed by 2025 which is the one hundredth anniversary of the Recreation Ground being gifted to the community.
