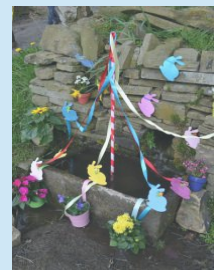

Solar Panels for the Co-op Roof



In October 2020, the Midgley Climate Action Group reported that the roof of the old Co-op building in Midgley was being considered for solar panels. These would generate electricity, reduce the carbon footprint of the shop and lower the electricity bills. The Group has continued their investigations and a survey will be carried out to check both the condition of the roof and its suitability for solar panels.

Last month, at the AGM of Midgley Matters Association Limited (the organisation that owns the old Co-op building) it was agreed that the Climate Group should continue this work, obtain some competitive quotes and present a case to the Management Group. In each of the last few years, some funds have been put aside to pay for the longer term maintenance of the building, and these could contribute towards the cost of a new roof (if needed) and solar panels.

There are also other areas of the building that need improvement, and the Management Group will be considering the best way to tackle all of these in the next few months.

As soon as there is heavy rain, this gets washed into the drains and ends up in the rivers adding to the plastic soup highlighted by David Attenborough in his Blue Planet series.
